INTRODUCTION TO HIGH HOLIDAYS

Welcome to Or Tzion's High Holidays 5784. All high holiday services and programming will be held at Or Tzion.

As we did last year, Or Tzion will host a hybrid high holiday service schedule allowing for as many in-person attendees and online streaming viewers as possible. There will be two, similar, in-person sessions of the same abbreviated service that will run consecutively during Rosh Hashanah Day 1, Kol Nidre and Yom Kippur morning; please see PAGE 2 in this Guidebook for the schedule. Both sessions will be available to stream online during the live service or can be viewed at a later time. On Rosh Hashanah Day 2, a full Rosh Hashanah service will take place which will also be live streamed for virtual viewing.

Whether you wish to be in-person or watch from home, we do ask that every member family unit complete the online high holiday registration form. The link to do that can be found at **otaz.org/5784. THE DEADLINE FOR COMPLETING REGISTRATION IS THURSDAY, 9/7.** We recommend completing the online registration as soon as possible to allow us to better accommodate our limited capacity in the sanctuary. Service assignments will be **emailed** to your family prior to the start of Rosh Hashanah (on or before Tuesday, 9/12). Please make sure to attend the service times to which you are assigned.

GIFT OF THE HEART

Every congregant household who wishes to take part in Or Tzion High Holiday programming must make a *Gift of the Heart* commitment. Your *Gift of the Heart* includes your membership dues, High Holiday seats for you and your immediate family members (up to age 23) and your Yom Kippur appeal. High Holiday tickets and access to services are only available to congregants.

Gift of the Heart asks congregants to participate in a voluntary giving model that creates sustained financial support so that Or Tzion can expand the opportunity to create positive memories and learning experiences for all of our members. Congregants making a Gift of the Heart commitment of \$3,600 or more will become a member of the M'orot (Luminary) Society, a benefactor program of Congregation Or Tzion.

SOME IMPORTANT REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

As we approach the start of Rosh Hashanah, each family unit will receive an email indicating where each person of the family has been placed for each individual service, whether it's IN-PERSON or VIRTUAL. You will need to print that email as your 'ticket' of entrance to the in-person service. Streaming links will be sent out prior to the start of the High Holiday services for all VIRTUAL service viewing. **Please carefully review your assignments so there is no confusion the day of services.**

NEW THIS YEAR

Family Services on Rosh Hashanah Day 2, Kol Nidre & YK Afternoon

Led by Rabbi Green, Cantor Rubinstein, and Andre Ivory, these services incorporate powerful music, inspiring story, joyful song, traditional liturgy, and meaningful learning to engage families of all ages in the ritual and transformation of these sacred days.

NEW THIS YEAR

HIGH HOLY DAYS KIDS' CLUB

Interactive High Holy Day programming for children, featuring crafts and storytime. Kids' Club will be led by inspiring, caring and qualified teachers and teen volunteers. There is no fee but **prior registration is required.** For safety, parents will be required to check children in and out of the rooms at the Kids' Club check-in table. Available for ages 3 & 4 and ages 5 to 7. Snack will be provided. Must be potty-trained.

Services for Families with Littles (for parents and children under 7):

Parents are encouraged to attend these services with child(ren). Age appropriate programs include holiday songs and stories for the youngest members. See schedule on page 2 for days and times; Apples & Honey Service on erev Rosh Hashanah is included in this category.

Youth Services - Grades 3 to 6

Education Director, Andre Ivory leades an experiential, fun-filled service with prayer, song, activities for children grades 3 to 6.

Teen Services - Grades 7 and up

Teens join their peers to bring in the new year. Every teen is welcome to come sing, pray and hang with friends in a service led by Youth Director, Sarah Bochenek.

STEP 1: START YOUR REGISTRATION

Due by Thursday, 9/7.Go to **otaz.org/5784**, click on **HIGH HOLIDAY REGISTRATION** tab

Indicate on the registration form how many adults and how many children are included in your membership. Children up to age 23 are included in the family membership. Any children above that age can create their own membership unit by making their own *Gift of the Heart* pledge.

Under each person's name, identify where each person wishes to participate in each of the High Holiday services, whether IN-PERSON or VIRTUAL, main services or family services.

STEP 2: BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

Every year, Congregation Or Tzion publishes the *Sefer Zikaron*, or Book of Remembrance. This is our congregants' opportunity to memorialize the names of loved ones to be viewed when we pray *Yizkor*, beginning on Yom Kippur. If you wish to contribute names to the book, please review the options below and enter the information on your registration.

There are multiple options for submissions to the Book of Remembrance

Premium Page: \$1000; fully customizable

Full Page: \$400; customizable

Half Page: \$200; lists up to 10 names Quarter Page: \$100; lists up to 5 names

Listed names: \$18 per name

Customizable pages may simply list names with your preferred wording, or include personal remembrances, memories, and/or images. Write your entry on the registration page or submit it to highholidays@otaz.org. We reserve the right to edit submitted content and will consult with you through this process.

To add your Book of Remembrance entry, simply click on '1' from the dropdown menu to begin the process. Under *Remembrance Categories and Costs*, choose 'yes' to the question that applies to the category you wish to purchase; enter names in the appropriate boxes (please check spelling!).

If you are a member of the M'orot Society, your commitment entitles you to a submission in the book at no extra charge: one-quarter page for those at the \$3,600 level; one-half page for those at the \$5,400 level; and a full page for those at the \$7,200 or higher level. **You do not need to submit your info on the registration page.** Simply email your info to Amy (or ask any pertinent questions) at highholidays@otaz.org.

STEP 3: BREAK-FAST

Don't miss the Or Tzion tradition!

Once again, we are offering a traditional, dairy Yom Kippur Break-fast to be served immediately in the social hall, following the final shofar blast. Adults are \$30/person; children 13 and under are \$20/person. Use the registration form to RSVP and complete your payment if you wish to join us!

STEP 4: SUKKOT

The Or Tzion Men's Club recommends The Sukkah Project, www.sukkot.com. for all of your Sukkah needs.

Sukkah Brigade: please answer these 2 questions

Question 1: Are interested in having the Men's Club Sukkah Brigade build your sukkah? The Sukkah Brigade will be building on Sunday, 9/24 starting at 7:30am. If yes, indicate that on the registration form along with your home address.

Question 2: Would you be willing to help build with the Men's Club Sukkah Brigade on Sunday, 9/24? If yes, please give us your name and contact info on the registration form. You don't have to be part of the Men's Club (or even a man...women are welcome too!).

Would you like to purchase a Lulav & Etrog for your home? Children's set \$36 each; Premium set \$54 each. Indicate quantity on registration page.

STEP 5: PROJECT ISAIAH

Project Isaiah is our annual High Holiday drive benefiting the community at large. It is named for the prophet Isaiah, who when asked why we fast on Yom Kippur, responded "Is it not to share your bread with the hungry?" (Isaiah 58:7). Without question, Or Tzion's members have been overwhelmingly generous in donating both money and food during our Project Isaiah drive each year.

Project Isaiah 5784 will benefit **St. Mary's Food Bank** and **Jewish Free Loan**. Congregants can fill donation grocery bags and/or make a financial contribution to support either, or both, of these worthy charities.

St. Mary's Food Bank is a non-denominational organization that addresses food insecurity in Maricopa County, affiliated with Feeding America. Did you know? AZ is among the worst for childhood food insecurity; nearly 1 in 4 children are at risk of going hungry; \$1 helps provide 7 meals; 95% of all donations go to the programs; they provide hundreds of thousands of meals each day; donating to St. Mary's means supporting hundreds of partners including child food programs, domestic violence shelters, homeless shelters, rehab centers, senior programs, and veterans.

Jewish Free Loan provides interest-free loans to Arizona's Jewish community to enhance the quality of life of Jewish Arizonans. These loans allow recipients to navigate life's expenses without the worry or burden of compounding interest.

Monetary donations can be made on your online registration; bags for food donations will be handed out on Rosh Hashanah to be returned at Kol Nidre or Yom Kippur services. Thank you, in advance, for your generosity in supporting these two worthy organizations.

FINALIZE YOUR REGISTRATION

The last section of the registration form asks if you want to contribute to the **Roz Goodell Education Fund.** This fund supports the religious school and other programs for children. Any amount is greatly appreciated.

To complete the form, click on the **CLICK HERE TO SUBMIT AND PAY** button. You will be taken to the payment form where you can pay for all High Holiday fees (if any accrued) on a credit card.

FAOs for REGISTRATION

Here are some answers to questions you might have:

- Q: When will my electronic ticket be emailed to me?
- A: You will receive an **email** with your and your family's assigned services on it **on or before Tuesday, September 12.** If you cannot locate your email, first check your junk or spam folder. If it's not there, please contact Amy at highholidays@otaz.org to have it resent to you.
- Q: When will I receive the streaming links for the High Holiday services for streaming from home?
- A: The email that will be sent on or before Tuesday, September 12 will contain all streaming links as well.
- Q: Do I have to complete the registration even if I wish to view all services virtually?
- A: Yes. We ask that each member family unit complete a registration even if you don't wish to attend in-person services.
- Q: I have more questions and cannot find answers in this booklet. Please help!
- A: Email Amy at highholidays@otaz.org for answers. If she doesn't know, she'll find out for you!

Would you like to borrow a mahzor to use at home during the High Holidays?

For congregants attending services virtually, you may borrow a book to use at home during the High Holiday season. Mahzorim are now available for pick-up during Or Tzion business hours and religious school. Please call the office to reserve. A \$36 per book charge will be added to your Or Tzion account if the book is not returned by November 1.

Tashlih, which literally translates to "casting off," is a ceremony in which Jews symbolically cast off the sins of the previous year by tossing pebbles or bread crumbs into flowing water.

Join fellow congregants for Kabbalat Shabbat and Tashlih ceremony. Everyone is encouraged to bring a picnic dinner to enjoy after services.


